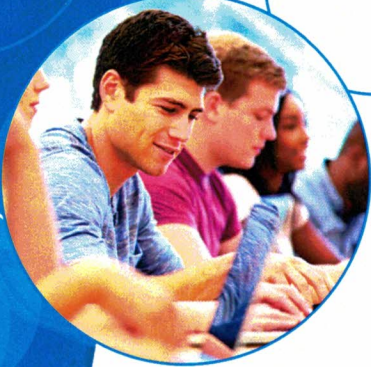

Saving Money

INFOhio, the PreK-12 digital library, works with Ohio public libraries, university libraries, and the State Library of Ohio to provide a collection of digital resources to everyone in the state. Through economy of scale, we're able to license these tools for a fraction of the cost schools would pay individually. And through wise use of state and federal funds, we're able to give all Ohio PreK-12 students free access.

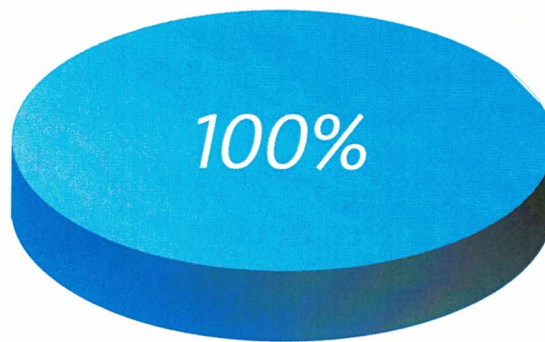
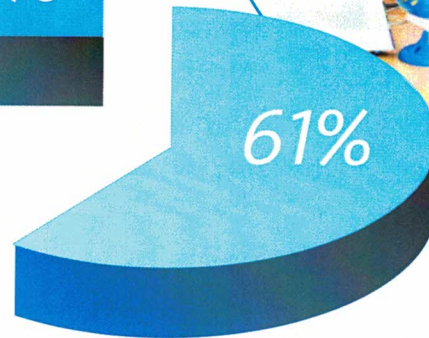
State and federal funds provide these online resources for all public and nonpublic PreK-12 schools, students, their parents, and educators across Ohio free of charge. The INFOhio Digital Library (the Core Collection) is funded in part through an Institute of Museum and Library Services LSTA grant awarded by the State Library of Ohio to Libraries Connect Ohio, a collaboration of Ohio's three library networks—INFOhio, OhioLINK, and OPLIN—that serve PreK-12, university, and public libraries, respectively.

Bridging A Digital Divide

25%: Districts that could afford to license some — not all — of the same digital resources for their students.

61%: Districts whose ONLY access to digital resources for their students is INFOhio.

100%: Percentage of Ohio's 1.9 million PreK-12 students who have free access to 26 premium research databases through INFOhio.



Why can't kids just use the *Internet?*

For everyday research needs — When was the Battle of the Bulge? What movie should I see this weekend? Should I try that new restaurant? — the Internet provides most of the information anyone needs. But for students in a rigorous academic program who are preparing for careers in science, math, medicine, law, or business, the Internet is not enough. Those students need access to high-quality, reliable journals, reports, and articles that aren't available for free on the Internet. INFOhio provides that access.

7.2 million: Number of articles students and educators downloaded for FREE last year through INFOhio databases.

23.9 million: Number of database searches Ohio students and educators conducted through INFOhio last year.

230,000: Number of times Ohio school districts streamed education videos for FREE last year through INFOhio's Digital Video Collection.

85%: Percentage of districts that take advantage of lower costs offered through INFOhio's economy of scale to license library management software.
